Peace to you,

During this past year, Angie and I have had the privilege of meeting with so many of our long-time friends and making many new friends. I am grateful for the quality and integrity of each person we have met, and being able to share with them this wonderful vision God has given us. I am always reminded that we have the privilege of representing these awesome people in Burma. We are honored to be their advocates!

The past three years have been incredible as we have watched what God is doing in Myanmar on the Legacy Campus. Throughout this year, God has continued to bless the work we are doing. The Legacy Campus land, Jehovah Jireh Rice farm purchase, and the building of Angie's House have all been major accomplishments. To God be the Glory! We are thankful to everyone who has helped contribute to these projects. Without you, they would not be possible.

I want to introduce you to three of the many girls who come to our school, and share why we believe in it so strongly.

First is our youngest student to ever complete training. She came to us at 14 years old. Immediately after her father died, her mother had heard about our school and sent her to us. She traveled for two days alone from her home in a mountain village. She did not know anyone, but simply my director's name. She ended up on his front porch one night and asked him if she could attend our school.



Our second story is amazing. Mrs. Lian Lawh came to us at 38 years old as one of our oldest students. She has been very busy as a stay-at-home mom and wife raising her six children. They range in age from 4 to 15 years old. Lian's husband works in India as a sales representative, but during the pandemic he has not been allowed to leave or enter the country. After delaying construction during the rainy season, we are ready to start again on the Legacy Building, this three-story, 7,500-square-foot structure will be our headquarters. It truly is more than a building. The first floor will be home to the Legacy Learning Center for our girls sewing school. We also plan to use this space to launch two new vocational training courses – small engine repair and electrical repair. Additionally, this floor will give us office space and a more adequate layout for training purposes. The second floor will be for the School of the Harvesters and a computer lab. The third floor will be an open-air space to help our students and staff stay comfortable during extreme summer temperatures. The building will also be used for dormitories, break areas, and English language classes.

This building enables us to be rent free, gives a permanent home to our schools, and makes a huge statement to the community at large that we are here to stay.

Classes had already been in session for three weeks. We had a three-year waiting list with our very limited classroom space. After talking with her, the director called me and told me her story. I asked him where the girl would stay. He replied that she could stay with his family. I told our director if he was willing to do that, we would make room for her. She graduated from our program and now, two years later, she is back home earning income to help support her family.



has been able to successfully set up her own sewing shop and can work from home. Not only is she able to earn an income to help support her family, but she now has the ability to make and mend clothes for her six children and husband. The sacrifices she made to come to our school were well worth the effort and the timing could not have been better.



We have another very special student. We love her heart and she has an infectious joy about her. She is also the first student to graduate from our school without the use of her legs. Since the age of three, she has not been able to use them. When she asked to enroll, we were not equipped to meet her needs. We didn't know if we could facilitate her properly. Remember, we were off the grid with no electricity. But we never want to turn anyone away, so we engineered a hand crank on her machine, built a table and chair especially for her, and made a couple of other adjustments so she could be off and learning. She has the best attitude of anyone I have ever met.



She is so joyful, loves to sing, and the girls voted her the number one student for graduation. They jokingly say that she can sew as good with one hand as they can with two. She so captured Angie's heart that she raised the money to buy a tricycle motor bike for her. It has given her the freedom to be an independent businesswoman.

Her story only gets better. She received the motor bike in December and has been working very hard with her sewing this year. In fact, she has saved all the money she made this year to buy four additional sewing machines. In October, she sent me pictures of this and, to our amazement, she has opened her own sewing school! Praise the Lord! That is discipleship!



These are just a few of the amazing young ladies you are touching and the lives that are literally changing. It is humbling to serve these women. Your gifts ensure they receive a 12-month education at no cost to them.

These three ladies are the type of girls that regularly come to the Legacy Campus. This new building and campus will serve people just like them. It truly is more than a building. It gives hope to the hopeless. We don't call it the Legacy Campus for nothing. Whenever you give to this building, you are leaving a Legacy that

changes lives and families forever. These students become a Legacy to change their community, country, and beyond.

You really are giving them a hope and a future. Every person who comes to our campus is one that will never have to endure the bonds of trafficking.
