This year has certainly been one of the most eye-opening I can ever remember. Many people have asked us what the status is in Myanmar during this time. Beginning August 1, all public schools will be in session with social distancing and face coverings. During this time of COVID-19, our girls at the sewing school made 200 masks and donated them to the local hospital. It was one of the biggest things to ever happen to our school! Soon after that goodwill gesture, we were approached by a national government representative who commissioned our school to produce masks for the government of Myanmar. They even provided the fabric!

Our students, with only four months of training, manufactured 2,200 masks to distribute in the region. This was a great success and extraordinary recognition for the Legacy Learning Center and its students, who all worked very hard to make it happen!

During these past few months, we have been working tirelessly at the Legacy Campus. After the completion of our orphanage, Angie's House, along with the shower and toilet building, garden, and soccer field, we took a small break. On February 1, we commenced the groundbreaking for our new Legacy Learning Center. This building will be the hub of all our training activities. It will be the new home for our various programs, including sewing school, computer training, evangelistic training (School of the Harvesters), and English classes.

This addition will help to alleviate the three-year waiting list for sewing training. In addition, this building will give our girls a more stable place to train. Another big plus is we will not have to move or pay rent anymore! The foundation was completed the third week of April. The next phase of the project is the steel structure. The contractor offered to complete all the steel work if we would give him 50 percent of the payment up front, and he would allow us to make payments to him later. This, again, is not a standard practice in Myanmar – but it is favor!

As of the second week of August, all steel is up, and the roof is being installed! It is so awesome to see the building come to life. All the villagers are talking and excited. In fact, they come faithfully each day to watch its construction. Of course, we are building as we go, so flooring, walls, and windows will be the next phase.

The other good news is Nu Len, our orphanage director, never had the room to plant a garden in any of the rented places she and the children lived, but not anymore. She has been teaching the children gardening. They have a beautiful garden planted with mustard greens, beans, and corn. This helps greatly with the budget, creates healthier diets, teaches the children a useful skill, and produces income. We also have completed our outdoor kitchen for the orphanage. It was much needed and a great addition for preparing all of those freshly harvested vegetables from the garden.

Another accomplishment this year was the drilling and installation of our second water well. This well will relieve the usage from our first well and give us better distribution all over the campus, serving the many people who will visit and learn there.

This is exactly why we are starting the **School of the Harvesters** in our new Legacy Learning Center, currently under construction on our Legacy Campus. We have fifty students already signed up, we have our books translated into the native language, and – with the completion of this building – we can begin training. It is exciting to train nationals to reach their people with proven methods. Not only that, but we will be bringing special guests, elite teams, and pastors to teach and train them also. We are so close to our goal for this project. The building foundation is finished, steel has been erected, and the roof is being installed – all paid for! Thanks to our Partners!

Now it is time to close in our 7,500-square-foot, three-story structure. **We are down to the last \$85,000 to finish this building.** With its completion, we chart a new course – training laborers to go into all the world. How can I say that, because we are strategically located between the two largest harvest fields on the planet, China and India. Not to mention the more than 400 million people in Southeast Asia, of which less than 10 percent are Christians. We ask you to consider how you could support this building and help us to advance the **Kingdom of God!**
